

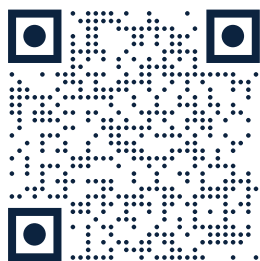

We've gathered some interesting facts about some of South Africa's most magnificent wild animals! Scan the QR code below each animal to get up close and personal with these amazing animals virtually!



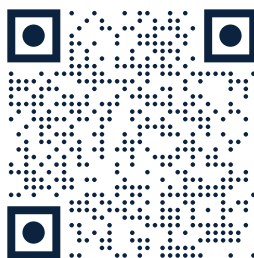
Zebras can run up to 65km per hour. New-born foals can stand after 6 minutes. A herd of zebras can also be called a dazzle.



SCAN TO VIEW IN 3D



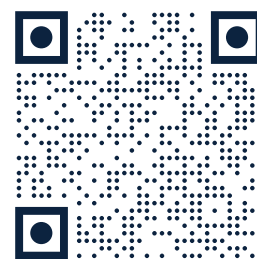
Male Lion's manes attract females and protect their necks and heads from injuries during fights. Lions rest for approximately 20 hours a day. Lion's love to hunt during storms, their eyes have adapted to the dark and the thunder and wind makes it harder for prey to hear them.

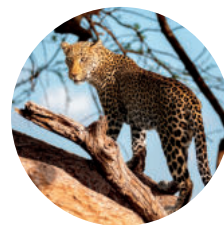
The Common-Slug Eater and Olive Whip Snake are 2 common species found in Hluhluwe Park. Snakes don't have eyelids. Snakes smell with their tongues.

At the establishment of the Natal Parks Board in 1947, less than 10 White Rhinos were left in the wild. These Rhinos were located in the Umfolozi region. With the establishment of Operation Rhino, many rhinos were transferred to different wildlife parks in the country, which resulted in almost 90% of the world's rhino population being situated in SA. Due to this, the genetic lines of all white rhinos in the world can be traced back to the Hluhluwe-Imfolozi Park.



The Leopard is considered one of the strongest predators. Leopards prefer medium sized prey with a body mass ranging from 10-40 kgs and leopards will usually climb a tree while carrying their prey!

Hluhluwe Safari Bingo!

It's no surprise that Hluhluwe-Imfolozi Park is home to some of the most spectacular wildlife in the world. The reserve is home to 86 mammal species, which includes the magnificent Big Five. All animals roam the park freely, enjoying the unique terrains of this area.
